

National/Region/County Awards

Oxfordshire Brooch

Can be awarded to both Members & Non-Members over the age of 18 - No upper age limit. Awarded by the County Commissioner and her Team to any adult (either a member or non-member) who has contributed to Girlguiding in Oxfordshire showing commitment or action(s) of an outstanding nature. Applications should be made in writing via Division Commissioner to County Commissioner. Remember, awards are not just a retirement gift!



County Commissioner's Certificate of Commendation

The County Commissioner's Certificate is awarded to a member or non-member of Girlguiding who has shown outstanding courage in her/his personal life or a Unit, District, or Division which has demonstrated great commitment to Guiding in their community, or has taken part in a special project to promote Guiding.



Good Service Brooch (County):

The Chief Guide or the Chief Commissioner or the County/Island Commissioner presents the Good Service Brooch to a member (uniformed adult up to her 65th birthday) for excellent service to Guiding. The nominee must hold a current appointment card or have completed an appointment no more than 6 months before the application is made.



Anglia Brooch and Certificate:

This can be awarded to a person whom the Anglia Awards Sub-Committee considers merits this award. Made for: commitment and level of service which has been over and above the call of duty, or a notable display of courage or fortitude, or a demonstration of initiative and devotion to duty (without risk to their own life)



The Anglia General Certificate

This can be awarded to any member of Girlguiding Anglia who has shown above average fortitude, courage, initiative, heroism or devotion to duty.



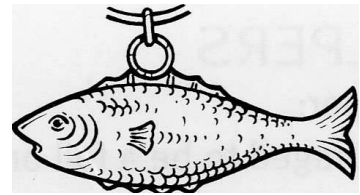
The Laurel Award

The Laurel Award is a Girlguiding UK Award presented by the Chief Commissioner to a member (uniformed adult up to her 65th birthday) in recognition of outstanding service to Guiding, which need not be at Association level. Members nominated for this award should ideally be at least 18 months from retirement and have held an appointment within 6 months of the nomination form being received by the Region Awards Sub-Committee.



The Silver Fish Award

This is the highest award that can be granted by Girlguiding UK. It is awarded to a member (uniformed adult up to her 65th birthday for outstanding service to Guiding in more than one capacity and a contribution to world Guiding. Members nominated for this award should ideally be at least 18 months from retirement and have held an appointment within 6 months of the nomination form being received by the Region Awards Sub-Committee



The Silver Cross

This award may be given to any uniformed member of Girlguiding Anglia in recognition of acts such as heroism that may, but need not, have involved risk to life.



The Star of Merit

The Star of Merit is given to any member aged between 5 and 26 years who has shown great courage and fortitude in her personal life, or initiative/responsibility at an incident. Nominations made as a result of an incident must be made within 6 months of the incident taking place.
